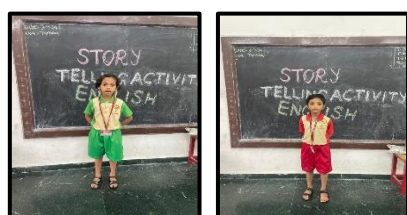
GANESH CHATURTHI

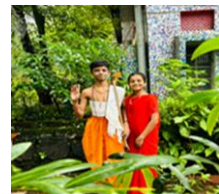
Doha Recital
